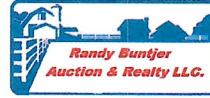

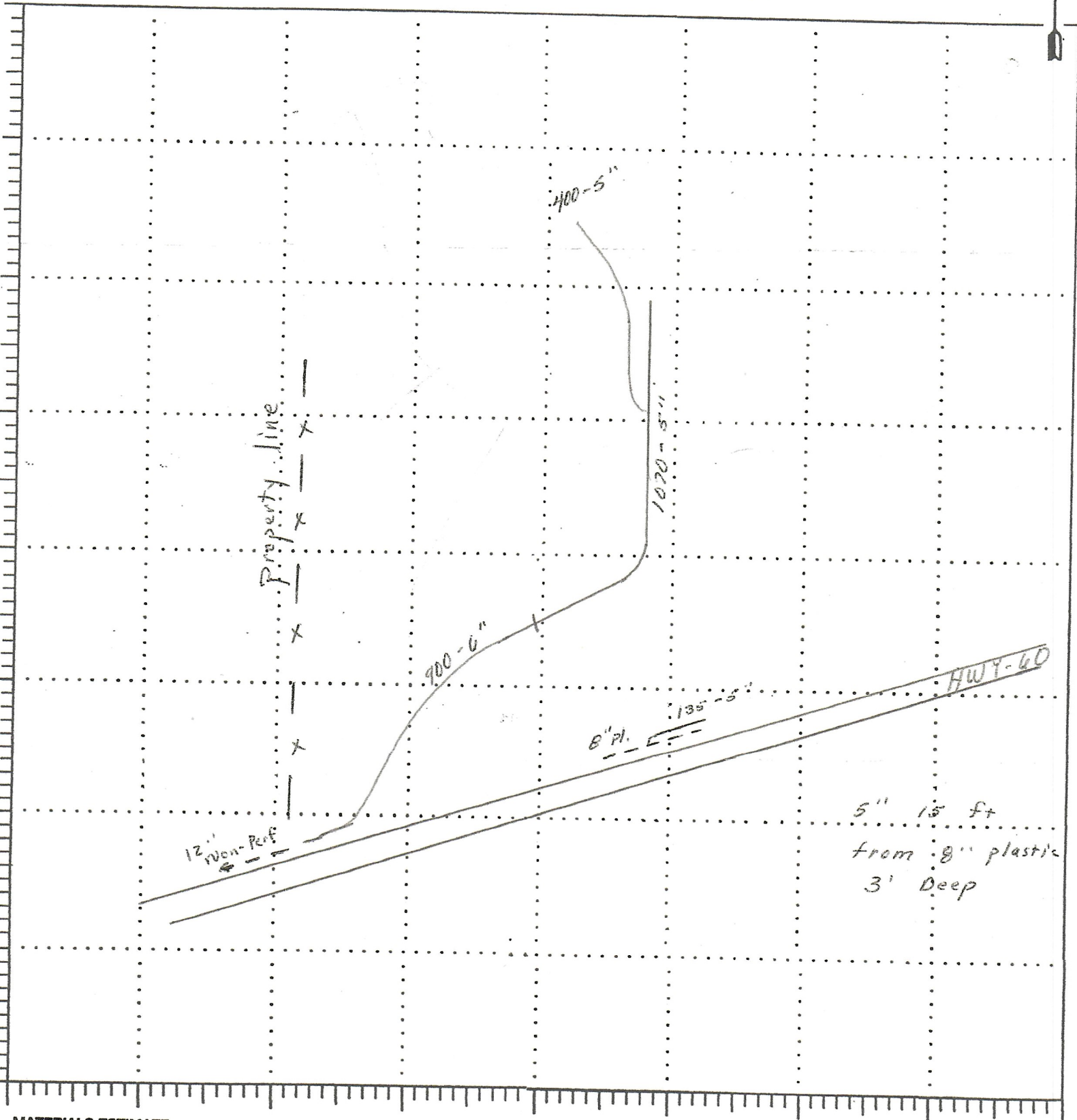

The Minnesota DOT has began filling the wetland area with dirt for the Highway 60 project. The Dot also plans to tile the area and will convert some of the area not covered by the Highway.

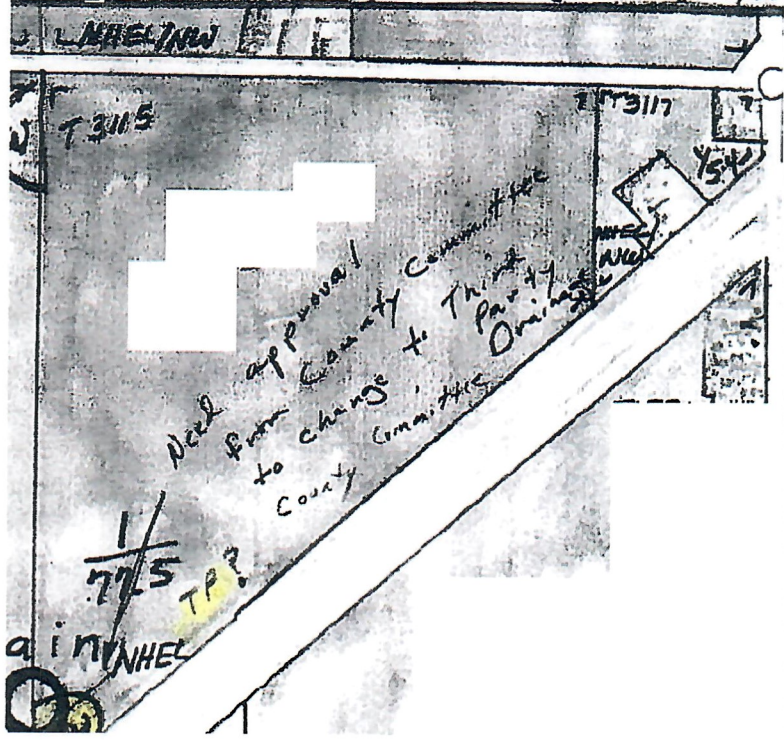
